NHS Test and Trace has identified that my child has been in close contact with someone who has tested positive for Covid-19	<p>DO NOT SEND YOUR CHILD TO SCHOOL.</p> <p>Contact school to inform us.</p> <p>Follow Test and Trace guidance</p>	<p>The identified household member must self-isolate for 14 days.</p> <p>Follow NHS Test and Trace guidance.</p>

NHS Test and Trace has identified a household member (other than my child) as a close contact of somebody with symptoms or confirmed Covid-19. Another child in school tests positive for Covid-19.	The school will follow its Track and Trace protocol and liaise with The Local Authority and Public Health England to determine which children will need to self-isolate. The school will notify parents at the earliest opportunity if their child/children need to self-isolate. IF IN SCHOOL, PARENTS MUST MAKE ARRANGEMENTS TO COLLECT THEIR CHILD IMMEDIATELY. All other children should continue to attend school as normal.	Your child may return after 14 days should they need to self-isolate. All other children should continue to attend school as normal.
I am unable to get a Test for someone in the household who has symptoms of Covid-19.	DO NOT SEND YOUR CHILD/CHILDREN TO SCHOOL. Contact school to inform us.	Your child/children may return to school after 14 days if no symptoms have developed.
My child is ill with symptoms not linked to Covid-19	Inform school as soon as possible.	Your child may return to school when they are well enough to attend.

St Bede's Track and Trace overview

Pupil displays symptoms of Covid-19 in school or parent contacts school to inform of pupil/home symptoms



Pupil(s) collected from/stay at home. All household members, including siblings in school, begin isolation period



Direct parents to book a test for their child. They must keep the school informed of relevant information



St Bede's Track and Trace process begins to determine who has been a close contact with the individual whilst they were showing symptoms and or during the 48 hours before they developed symptoms.

Test is positive



Parent to **immediately inform** school and pupil and household to isolate for allocated time.



School to notify by Group Call, the parents of those pupils who have been determined as being a close contact. They must now begin to self-isolate and book a Test.

Test is negative



If a family member tests positive, the remaining **14 day** isolation period must be served regardless of the outcome of pupil test.



If pupil tests negative, pupil can return to school if no further symptoms develop. Please contact school to agree a return to school date.
