February is a great time to focus on Apprenticeships as it is the time when many organisations recruit their Apprentices for Summer. Remember, you can apply for an apprenticeship even if you have already made an application to a college.

February Focus: Apprenticeships and Traineeships

Apprenticeships are an exciting option; you receive hands-on training and also the chance to put your skills into practice in the workplace. Apprenticeships are available at multiple levels and ages; from school leavers, people upskilling in their careers and complete career changes. There are hundreds to choose from and include qualifications that range from level 2 to degree level. **Traineeship** courses are aimed at giving 16- to 18-year-olds the opportunity to develop the skills they need to find, and succeed in, employment or progress onto an Apprenticeship. They involve a work experience element and are paid.

To begin your search into apprenticeships and traineeships the following links provide you with lots of information about what apprenticeships are, how much you will be paid and where apprenticeships can lead you. Apprenticeships can begin at any age, not just 16, so it is worth investigating even if you do not want to follow that route as soon as you leave school.
